

June 10th-12th, 2025 Missouri State Fairgrounds (Sedalia, MO)

Entries must be postmarked by May 12th, 2025 (1 Entry Form per Exhibitor)

General Rules:

- The Midwest JR. Suffolk Show is open to exhibitors who are 21 years of age or less as of June 10th, 2025.
- Animals may be owned or leased by the exhibitor. All registration certificates are required and must be processed by the North American Suffolk Sheep Society or the United Suffolk Sheep Association.
- Entries can be shown in the Midwest Stud Ram Sale and The Midwest JR. Suffolk Show and then sold in the Midwest Stud Ram Sale
- Exhibitors must be present to show their own entries unless physically impaired. If two animals are entered in the same class, another exhibitor/or junior must show the other entry. With no lower age limit, the junior exhibitor must still be physically capable of showing (setting legs or holding head) his or her own sheep they can be aided by another junior.
- All entries must be postmarked by May 12th.
- Appropriate entry fees must be enclosed with entry form.

- All entry will require health papers.
- Check in will take place at the sheep barn on the Missouri state fair grounds. Registration Papers will be verified if copies are not submitted with entry fees.
- Exhibitors will be restricted to two entries per class.
- All sheep entered must have a registration number from the North American Suffolk Sheep Society or the United Suffolk Sheep Association.
- No inhumane treatment of animals will be allowed. No muzzles allowed.
- Neither The Midwest JR. Suffolk Show, Midwest Stud Ram Sale, or the Missouri State fair will be held responsible in case of any accidents.
- Classes will be split if 20 head or more are entered in one class
- There will be an Overall Champion in both Ram & Ewe Divisions.
- Pay-out will be given to the top five placings in each class unless the class size is less than 10 head, then Pay-outs will be adjusted to a top 3 pay-out. Amounts are dependent on the total entry count.
- Showmanship Classes must enter sheep in the Midwest Suffolk Junior Show to compete in Showmanship.

Health Requirements:

- The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms of evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
- Sheep imported into Missouri for exhibition:
 - Must have a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within 30 days preceding exhibition opening date; and
 - The owner and the veterinarian must attest to the following statement written on the certificate of veterinary inspection "the sheep in this shipment are not known to be under any movement restriction because of scrapie."

• All sheep must carry a USDA scrapie tag.

- Senior Showmanship (Ages 16-21 by date of show)
- Intermediate Showmanship (Ages 12-15 by date of show)
- Junior Showmanship (Ages 8-11 by date of show)
- Novice Showmanship (7 and under)
- Must enter animal in The Midwest Suffolk JR.
 Show TO ENTER SHOWMANSHIP
- No assistance in setting up sheep is allowed in showmanship classes.
